What I Did Over the Summer

Children and teens are returning to school. Many will asked to demonstrate their creative writing and grammatical skills with an essay about what they did on their summer vacation. Here is my answer to that question.

This summer I read a lot. I sat outside on my front porch when the weather permitted, which was not too often. We had to endure many days of excessive heat with little rain. But this summer I also studied the Scriptures intensively and composed three sermons.

We Deacons are sometimes called on to lead a Divine Worship Service. This summer I led three such services. One was here at Trinity Hicksville in mid-July. Pastor Hopkins was on vacation. The second was the First Sunday in August. Pastor Travis Yee needed someone to fill in for him at Trinity Glen Cove. He was training in Army Chaplaincy school in South Carolina.

The third service occurred two weeks later at the chapel at Gilgo Beach. Every year Deacons and pastors from our Long Island churches take turns conducting a service for the folks who live there in the summer. Members of Trinity have been doing this since the 1950s because, years ago, many of our members had summer homes out there. This was my fifth visit to Gilgo. But this year, due in part to COVID, there were only five in attendance besides me and John Doughty who assisted me and led the singing as the pianist had taken ill. But as the Lord has told us, wherever two or three are gathered in My Name, there am I in their midst. And it was so! I preached about Hebrews 12, how the Lord uses adversity to discipline us to increase our faith and our righteousness. He draws us closer to Him in times of stress and hardship so we will trust Him for all things.

The Lord uses adversity to weed out the things that are bad in us, to rid us of all the things we trust in to get us through tough times, such as money and possessions, medicine or medical technology, or as in these days of pandemic, self-proclaimed experts, media talking heads, and pontificating politicians. We seem to trust a lot of people who are ready and willing to tell us how to live the good life. We even trust ourselves to know what is best for ourselves. The Lord wants us to trust Him, and Him alone.

Choirs Rehearsals Resume for the Fall

On August 22, 1741, George Frederick Handel locked himself in his place of residence until September 14. It seems like an odd thing to do, but Handel had with him paper, ink, pens and a script of verses compiled from the King James Bible by Charles Jennens. When Handel emerged from his home, he had with him the music for his oratorio, *Messiah*, the two and a half hour piece was written in its entirety during that three week period. What a miraculous achievement, it was not performed though, until April of 1742. Why did such a great piece of music take so long to receive its first performance? No matter how good the musicians are, it takes time to learn the notes and turn the scribbles on a piece of paper that we call notes into music.

Trinity's choirs have been singing for services for many years, disrupted only by a pandemic. We spend many weeks working on each of our anthems to turn them into music to enhance worship. We still have Covid with us, but are hopefully, with new vaccines, going to start to put it in the rear view mirror and try to return to some normalcy.

Rehearsals for Trinity Choir will begin on Thursday night, September 22 at 8:00 p.m. We are hoping to sing on a more regular basis, and are praying that Covid doesn't interrupt us this year. This would be a great time for those of you that may have thought about singing with our choir to join in. We encourage you to do that. I am also very hopeful that Sounds of Praise, our children's choir for grades 2-6 unchanged voices, will also begin rehearsals on Thursday, October 6 at 3:30 pm. I am very much looking forward to having them rejoin our services, since we have not been able to rehearse at all during Covid. From the Board of Outreach

"If I say to the wicked, O wicked one, you shall surely die, and you do not speak to warn the wicked to turn from his way, that wicked person shall die in his iniquity, but his blood I will require at your hand. But if you warn the wicked to turn from his way, and he does not turn from his way, that person shall die in his iniquity, but you will have delivered your soul." (Ezekiel 33:8-9)



Evangelism is one of the primary missions of the Church. We are each called to be watchmen, to sound the warning to the lost, to share the gospel with them. But some believers are unaware of the necessity for evangelism. Or some think that they are poor speakers, or claim "It's not my gift." or "It's not my ministry." Or maybe they feel that criminals, prostitutes, and perverts deserve the life they lead and are not worthy of our efforts.

Every Christian is commissioned to preach the gospel, in different ways to different people at different times for there, as the prophet Ezekiel indicated, great urgency. And that urgency has to do with the consequences that befall the people who do not believe because they have not heard the gospel, or more likely, heard only words of condemnation or hate from the mouths of Christians: the torments of Hell for all eternity. A lot of people, even many who call themselves Christian do not like to think about Hell. Some may even think "Hell! Get real! That's so medieval! There's no such thing. Hell is only a story, a fairy tale meant to frighten kids so they will mind their manners and obey their parents." Or some might say as many Christians do "God is so forgiving that He would never send anyone to Hell."

This idea of universal salvation is quite common in our culture. Everyone likes to think that their deceased loved ones are all in heaven. This is especially true when that deceased person is a child or is someone who has died tragically in a car accident or terrorist bombing or at the hands of a psychopathic killer. The common belief is that the loved one went straight to heaven simply because of the violent, unexpected, and tragic way they died. Such a thought comforts the grieving and enables them to carry on in their lives for the alternative is really very scary and demoralizing. No one knows what is in store for them. Who knows that maybe the person you greet this afternoon at the supermarket or the restaurant might not be plunged into Hell before tomorrow morning. It is vital that we carry out the great commission and bring the gospel to the lost before it is too late. And that means telling them about the need for faith in Jesus who died for their sins so they can enjoy with Him forever the glories of His eternal Kingdom of Heaven.

From the Board of Stewardship



Next month, Trinity's Board of Stewardship will sponsor a Consecrated Stewards Program. This will culminate in Consecration Sunday on October 16 with one service followed by brunch. On that Sunday, we, the members of the congregation will have an opportunity to renew our weekly monetary pledges and, if possible, increase them. This we do every Autumn as it is harvest time and we honor the Lord as we remember His blessings and give Him thanks for them all.

Luther's Small Catechism gives us some fundamental reasons for consecrated giving. These speak to the motivation and the call to stewardship as an aspect of discipleship.

The First Article: Creation

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

What does this mean? I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them. He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life. He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him.

The Second Article: Redemption

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

What does this mean? I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity.

Why should we give our resources to the Church? The Lord God has blessed us by giving us all we have. We glorify Him by using His blessings to both encourage the faithful and preach the Gospel of faith in Jesus Christ to unbelievers.

"The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work. . . He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness. You will be enriched in every way to be generous in every way, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God." (2 Corinthians 9:6-8, 10)

Hope everyone have had an enjoyable summer and are ready to be busy again.


