Christ Jesus brings his word and presence to where you are and he is even willing to do so through your personally present Deacon.

If you desire a visit, or you know someone who desires a visit, then let your request be known to the Church office. It will be through the means of grace, augmented by the presence of one who represents Jesus that God will deal with you in mercy and goodness because of his love for you in Jesus Christ.

Minister of Music

"O Day Full of Grace" LSB 503



What a joyous day a birthday is! Something to be celebrated every year, well until we hit that certain year, maybe it was 39? The Day of Pentecost, 50 days after Easter, is the Christian church's birthday. The tongues of fire, the mighty wind, the disciples speaking in tongues, and 3000 being baptized, these were the outward signs that Jesus had sent his Spirit as he had promised. It is a day to be celebrated year after year.

On Pentecost this year, May 19, we will sing one of the great Pentecost hymns of the church, "O Day Full of Grace." It is still fairly new for us here, but a hymn that is surely memorable, with a text that speaks to us from year to year. It comes to us from Denmark, the earliest versions of it date to 1450. However, the version known and sung in current hymnals was assembled by Danish hymn writer and pastor, Nikolai Gruntvig. It was written to celebrate the millennium of Christianity in Denmark. The hymn highlights the word grace, or the giving of something not deserved. We receive God's love and mercy through Jesus sacrifice on the cross.

The text of the hymn, like many hymns from Scandinavia, references light and darkness, which makes sense for countries that are covered in darkness through much of the winter, and the return of light, was celebrated. The first two verses trace God's grace in Jesus to be promised to us, as we celebrate in Advent and by Jesus birth to us at Christmas, again with the references to the darkness of sin, and the light of Christ. "God, shine for us now in this dark place; your name on our hearts emblazon" (v. 1), "How blest was that gracious midnight hour when Christ in the flesh was given... then rose o'er the world that sun divine which gloom from our hearts has driven" (v. 2). We are then brought to the cross, where Christ's work of salvation was completed by his death and the empty tomb. "Christ bore our sins and not his own... and then he arose and moved the stone, that we... might join with angelic hosts to raise our voices in endless singing." (v. 3). In verse 4, Pentecost is described as God coming to us. "God came to us then at Pentecost... all darkness for us dispelling." Finally, in the last verse, we are brought to the end of our lives, and into eternity, reminding us that the Spirit's work is to strengthen us and keep us in God's Word. There in heaven, "we will gather in song, all joy of heaven sharing, and walk in the light of God's own place, with angels his name adoring." (v.5). This powerful hymn takes us through the life of Christ and shows us the wonders of God's grace. Here is a link to hear this powerful hymn of promise. It was prepared during Covid. and musicians sent in their solo performances, which were then assembled into one performance. In the end over 1300 musicians participated in this video, including a couple from our own church, can you find them?

From the Board of Outreach

""Behold, I am coming soon, bringing my recompense with me, to repay each one for what he has done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end." Blessed are those who wash their robes, so that they may have the right to the tree of life and that they may enter the city by the gates. Outside are the dogs and sorcerers and the sexually immoral and murderers and idolaters, and everyone who loves and practices falsehood." (Revelation 22:12-15)

These days with all the violence and bloodshed going on in the Middle East over Israel as well as in our own country, many see these events as precursors of the return of Jesus. Add in the terrible storms raging across the globe, volcanic eruptions, and solar eclipses and many think this is the beginning of the end. This may be why we can find great comfort in these words that close the book of Revelation. They provide comfort and hope to believers. Unfortunately, they serve as a warning to others of the end result of their sin and unbelief: eternity outside of God's Kingdom.

What non believers claim to believe and how they live indicate that they are opposed to the tenets of the Kingdom of God. Such opposition is characteristic of the ideals of the United States and most of the nations of the world. Sure they may espouse freedom from oppression, want, hunger, and fear for all but, in practice, most rulers, politicians, and governments lie. Those who seize power by force or mob rule, or are elected or appointed to positions of trust, power and responsibility, invariably become greedy, proud, and corrupt. For all human efforts, all human striving to produce a peaceful and perfect world have failed and continue to do so.

True freedom or joy is found not in laws that are designed to promote equality, autonomy, and self-determination. The source of joy and true freedom is found in these closing words of the Book of Revelation: surrender and total submission to God who loves us. Here He encourages us to remain faithful, to persevere in loyalty to Him in the midst of persecution, suffering, sacrifice, and loss. God's outpouring of wrath upon sinful humanity will shortly occur, indeed, it may already be occurring as we see in these dark days of pandemic, lawlessness, and violence. We need to hold fast to the light of Christ and that vision we have seen of our reward. If we persevere, we will receive blessings and joy beyond what we have ever imagined that will more than make up for what we have lost for the sake of faith in Christ.

Jesus Christ alone has the only true and permanent solution for all the world's troubles. And He has entrusted that key to us, His church: the gospel of salvation found only in the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. May we ever be faithful to uphold and preach this truth.

From the Board of Stewardship

More Than a Negative

Even if you've never had to testify in court, a thousand TV shows have made you familiar with the question, "Do you swear to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?" Why not just make people swear to tell the truth? Or make them promise not to lie?

Any parent who has ever had to interrogate a child about a broken cookie jar or a scuffle over a toy knows the answer. There are plenty of ways to try to get out of trouble without *technically* lying. You tell *just enough* of the truth to skate on by.

We often play the game of seeing *how close* we can get to sinning without *technically* going over the line. But in our heart of hearts we know that this is not what God intended when He gave us the commandments. He's not giving us a merely negative rule and challenging us to just barely stay away from this or that. There is much more to each commandment than a prohibition. We shouldn't just avoid murdering people: we should be of service to our neighbor, doing good to promote their welfare and safety.

For each negative prohibition in the commandments there is a positive good that we are to cherish and protect. In the Eighth Commandment, that gift is the reputation of our neighbor and our relationship with him:

You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

Your relationship with your family members (who are your nearest neighbors), the other members of your congregation, your coworkers and your friends is one of the most precious gifts you have been given. You need to exercise good stewardship with this gift just as much as you need to exercise good stewardship with your life, resources, time, and income. This is an especially fragile gift because it's easy to ruin a relationship with slander and talking behind someone's back.

But speaking well of your neighbor in Christian love is absolutely free; it costs you nothing, yet it pays you great dividends. If you find this challenging at times, if you are tempted to speak ill of others, just remember that this other person is also a beloved child of God for whom your Lord Jesus suffered and died. Your Lord Jesus loves you both.



Comfort Dog Ministry






The Comfort Dog Ministry had the honor to attend the vigil and funeral of Officer Jonathan Diller. With over thousands in attendance at each event representing all divisions of first responders, along with the organization Project Thank-A-Cop, Abraham and Beloved provided comfort to those in attendance and a sense of respect to the fallen officer.

Seven of the Hearts of Mercy crosses were assembled and delivered to Baltimore and Team Kezia to have on hand for any memorial needs due to the Key Bridge collapse. At the time of this update there are two workers still missing and a possible memorial service being planned for April 16 or 17. At that time, the Southeastern District LCMS feel all search options would be exhausted and it would be an appropriate time to memorialize the lost.

Over the next few weeks the dogs will be visiting various churches and schools in the district and beyond to be part of children's sermons and special events. So begins the Tour de Dogs for Spring 2024. For the month of March only on Fridays did the dogs not have a visit scheduled. In May the dogs will be traveling to Keene, New Hampshire to visit Trinity Lutheran School for the day. Pastor Harkey of this congregation was part of the deployment of dogs to Maine during a shooting that took place in October of last year. We are currently the only active dog team in the Northeast and requested for this visit.




