# **Today's Music**

When were our hymns written? Many people would respond, hundreds of years ago. That is true for some of our hymns, "A Mighty Fortress," for example, which we will sing next week. However, new hymns still continue to be written, written, sung and prayed. Writing a hymn is a difficult task, a lot more complicated than rhyming some words, and the melody must be simple, memorable and also sing-able.

Today, the Trinity Choir will sing one of these new hymns, composed within the last 20 years. The powerful tune was composed by Minneapolis organist Tim Strand, and the text written by prolific hymn writer, the late Susan Cherwien. Her texts are appearing in more and more denominational hymnals because of their quality, and the images they inspire. This text encourages us, the church, to not just sit in the pew, but rise and do Christ's work here on earth. It was originally intended as a recessional hymn, or even a post communion hymn, as we rise to leave the church.

The prelude and postlude were written by Susan Cherwien's husband, David Cherwien, recently retired from Mount Olive Lutheran Church in Minneapolis and as conductor of the National Lutheran Choir. He is internationally known as a composer and for his inspiring hymn playing and improvisations. David, as composer, here interprets his wife's words into music. The arrangement of the anthem also comes out of Minnesota, as it is arranged by Dr. John Ferguson, who for many years served St. Olaf College in Northfield, MN. Please enjoy the powerful text and tune, may it inspire your worship today.
