MUSIC FOR PALM SUNDAY

I've written often about upcoming choir music, particularly for Christmas and Easter. This month I would like to highlight the music that Trinity Choir will sing on Palm Sunday, April 13 this year. The music that they will sing is the "Benedictus" from "The Armed Man: A Mass for Peace" by Welsh composer, Sir Karl Jenkins (b. 1944). The full Mass contains 13 sections, this is the twelfth. The text, in Latin, is one that we sing each week in service – "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, Hosanna in the highest!" The title of the mass, *The Armed Man*, is taken from the title of a 15th century French song, which includes the words, "the armed man is to be feared." The original song is featured at the beginning and the end of the mass, but not in the Benedictus section. The entire mass was written in memory of those who lost their lives in the Kosovo wars of the early 1990's. It is a piece, as a whole, that speaks against the tragedies of war.

When we arrive at the Benedictus section, the mood of the mass changes, and there is a ray of hope. The hope of a time where there is no more war, only peace, a time that only Christ can bring us. The entire mass has been described as a classic of the choral literature, and the Benedictus itself declared one of the most beautiful pieces composed in the last fifty years. The music was recorded after the initial performance and was released on CD for the first time on September 10, 2001. The next day, September 11, 2001, the world was left in shock, as the horrors of that day unfolded in the United States.

The music for the Karl Jenkins' Benedictus, particularly in Europe, was picked up as a musical theme for the coverage of the events, and as such, has been linked with these events. Its message of hope and peace resonated with the listeners.

The Benedictus opens and closes with a short, beautiful melody in both the orchestra and choir, in the middle section, jubilant Hosannas burst forth in the music, as if all heaven itself were coming down to earth.

We hope that the Benedictus will enhance your worship on Palm Sunday this year. I have included a link so that you can listen to this piece of choral music, and encourage anyone curious to listen to the rest of *The Armed Man Mass* by Sir Karl Jenkins.

Our next big fundraiser is Wingo, which is scheduled for Friday, May 2. You can get involved in a variety of ways. We are always in need of mone-








